I hope you are all well and enjoyed your week! It has been a busy week in school with visitors, including animal visitors, curriculum work, visits to Forest View and Enterprise Works (Nexus Head Quarters) and delivery of Team Teach training for our new starting staff.

ONLINE SAFETY

According to Ofcom, 69% of under-18s use a smartphone as their main method of going online. Additionally, 49% of children use them for online gaming – putting smartphones only behind consoles (59%) as the device of choice for playing games on. What the statistical evidence shows is the huge importance of phones to young people.

Given that Santa's recent visit is likely to have bestowed smartphones on an even greater number of young people, it's a particularly opportune moment to ensure that children are



able to use their handsets responsibly – and, above all, safely. From passcodes to parental controls, and from screen time to scams, our #WakeUpWednesday guide has the essential advice. I will share the Smartphone Safety Tips on Class Dojo for families to access.

CHANGES OF LEADERSHIP

Kirsty will be picking up day-to-day organisation and be the main point of contact for families. Carl will continue to be involved with ongoing pieces of work with specific families.

PRIMARY

Primary pupils have continued their learning about Animal Kingdoms and especially enjoyed meeting our visitors from Animal House. In Rainbows class, pupils have been sharing the text 'Owl Babies'. They made their own owl baby pictures using different materials and then went on a nature walk to find out about their habitats, collecting twigs and leaves on their travels. Pupils in Purple class have been finding out about pond habitats this week and will continue their work throughout this term,
