## PRIMARY

What a lovely week. Some of our younger pupils have been joining in with action rhymes and songs in maths to help them to look for patterns and develop some counting and number skills. It has been lovely to see them so active and engaged in their learning. In some classes, pupils are extending their skills even further by exploring the length of different objects in and around the classroom; using vocabulary such as short, long and tall. In order to extend this further, some pupils have used standard units of measure and have been supported to use rulers and metre sticks.

In English, work has continued on Fables. Our Little Explorers have shared the story of the 'Lion and the Mouse' and matched adjectives to the two characters in order to describe them. Other classes have been sharing the story of the 'Tortoise and the Hare', acting out the events together.

Our Animal Kingdoms topic is now in full flow and all classes are working on finding out about animals. In Rainbows, our pupils have been exploring different animals from the jungle and have made handprint pictures to represent their favourites. Their artwork is simply stunning and we are very proud of their efforts! Well done everyone!

## **SECONDARY**

It's been another fab week up in secondary and 6<sup>th</sup> form, with everyone engaged in their learning and showing great enthusiasm:

**Holly class** – have been celebrating Chinese New Year through exploring musical instruments and Dragon dancing. They have also looked at 'ready, steady, go' references for our sensory story of the Hare and the Tortoise and we have used water shoots, car tracks and the Blue Bots.
